

IPU DATA PROTECTION STATEMENT - IPU Academy

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) is designed to give individuals more control over their personal data. Under the GDPR, individuals have the following rights:

- The right to be informed;
- The right of access;
- The right to rectification;
- The right to erasure;
- The right to restrict processing;
- The right to data portability;
- The right to object; and
- Rights in relation to automated decision making and profiling.

- 1. The Irish Pharmacy Union (IPU) Academy uses personal information to provide members, pharmacists and registered pharmaceutical assistants, with Continued Professional Development (CPD) services.
- 2. The IPU complies with EU GDPR and the Data Protection Act 2018.
- 3. The IPU Head of Information & Technology is the person who is responsible for compliance with all data protection issues.
- 4. The IPU Professional Development and Learning Manager is the person to whom IPU Academy members may address applications for access to their personal data.
- 5. IPU Academy member information is held on a secured Learning Management System (LMS) hosted by Synergy Learning.
- 6. Information on IPU Academy members will not be kept for longer than is necessary and will be disposed of in a safe and secure manner.
- 7. Access to computers and manual records is restricted to authorised personnel only. Access to computers is password protected and anti-virus software is in use. A firewall is used to protect systems connected to the internet. The IPU building is alarmed and secure when not occupied.
- 8. If a member wishes to obtain a copy of any information relating to them. They can make a written request to the IPU Professional Development and Learning Manager.

- 9. If a member wishes to have any information relating to them deleted. They can make a written request to the IPU Professional Development and Learning Manager.
- 10. If a member believes that information kept about them is inaccurate, they have the right to have that information corrected.
- 11. If a request for third party disclosure of member information is made, they will be referred to the IPU Professional Development and Learning Manager who will determine if disclosure is appropriate.
- 12. If there is a breach of data protection, the Data Protection Commission will be notified within 72 hours along with the affected data subjects.
